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69. As you may know, many people lawfully enter the U.S. on renewable work visas. People on these visas may also bring their minor children with them. However, these children eventually "age out" of their dependent status after they turn 21 and are often forced to leave the country. Typically, an employer could prevent this by sponsoring the worker and their family for green cards. But in recent years, the green card line has become over a decade long, causing many children who were raised in America to "age out" of their legal status before they receive their green card.
