Time Commitment:

- Some additional time to be involved in extra projects throughout the year too, dependent on what the cohort project will be.

Role Duration:

- You can be a Young Ambassador until your 26th birthday.
- Cohort one to start February 2025 to February 2026

Salary:

None, voluntary role, expenses are available to cover travel and special visits to other organisations.
