## ROZHODNUTÍ SMÍŠENÉHO VÝBORU EHP

č. 33/2004

ze dne 19. března 2004,

kterým se mění příloha XXI (Statistika) Dohody o EHP

SMÍŠENÝ VÝBOR EHP,

s ohledem na Dohodu o Evropském hospodářském prostoru ve znění Protokolu o úpravě Dohody o Evropském hospodářském prostoru (dále jen „Dohoda“), a zejména s ohledem na článek 98 této dohody, vzhledem k těmto důvodům:
