Executive Summary

The UK Foundation Programme Office coordinated a national process for recruitment to F2 Stand-alone programmes commencing in August 2019. In previous years, there was also the opportunity for applicants to apply for F1 Stand-alone. Due to the number of applications submitted for the two-year Foundation Programme in October 2018, the likelihood of oversubscription at the start of 2019 was high and therefore recruitment to F1 Stand-alone post was not a requirement this year.

Wales were not included in the recruitment process for F2 Stand-alone programmes this year. With the exception of 2018, historically, Wales have opted to recruit to Locum Appointment to Service (LAS) posts if necessary and this was the approach taken for 2019 recruitment.

A total of 1,159 applicants applied, 812 were invited to attend an interview with 808 of whom attended for interview. A total of 673 applicants were deemed appointable. The process yielded an overall fill rate of 60.51%. Of a total of 1,159 who applied, 362 received offers, 175 of whom either declined or let their offers expired. A total of 23 an accepted offer, which they later sought to withdraw from.

At the end to the process, only 70 new appointments were made, i.e. to external applicants and not those currently working as part of a two-year programme. A total of 30 F2 posts remained unfilled at the end of the process and were released to local employing organisations to recruit Locum Appointments for Service (LAS).

Background / Introduction

Every year there is a significant cohort of applicants who are not eligible for entry to the foundation programme at F1 level as they hold full registration with the General Medical Council (GMC), but are too inexperienced in either the NHS and / or clinical experience to apply for specialty training.

Historically, recruitment to F2 Locum Appointment to Training (LAT) posts has typically been conducted by individual foundation schools.

In 2016, NHS Education for Scotland (NES), Health Education England (HEE) and Northern Ireland recruited applicants with full registration to unfilled F1 training posts. In 2017, the UKFPO administered a national process for recruitment to F1 stand-alone posts and foundation schools assumed responsibility for local / regional interview centres and managed their own recruitment processes for F2 Stand-alone.

The UK Foundation Programme Office (UKFPO) led a national process for recruitment to F1 and F2 Standalone programmes to commence in August 2018. This was the first year the UKFPO had conducted an entirely centralised process for recruitment to F2 Stand-alone programmes.

This year (2019), F2 Stand-alone programmes were recruited to nationally through the UKFPO.

F2 Stand-Alone Programmes

All Stand-alone posts are recognised training posts with equivalent educational supervision and access to the foundation ePortfolio. Trainees are offered the same development opportunities as those completing F2 as part of a two-year programme.

Stand-alone training posts are fixed-term for one-year.

Applications

All applications for F2 Stand-alone programmes were submitted and managed through the national online application system (Oriel). A total of 1,159 were submitted for F2 Stand-alone programmes due to commence in August 2019.

The table below provides a summary of the number of applicants by nationality group.

A total of 177 UK nationals who graduated from overseas medical schools applied for F2 Stand-alone programmes.

Eligibility / Long-Listing

Applications were long-listed by the UKFPO central team in accordance with the eligibility criteria for F2. Clinician-led panels was convened to consider ineligible applications as a quality assurance mechanism.

Of the 1,159 applicants who applied for F2 Stand-alone, a total of 812 applicants were considered eligible and invited to attend for interview and 347 were deemed unsuccessful in accordance with the person specification criteria and withdrawn.

The table below provides a summary of the number of applicants who were considered eligible and invited to attend for interview and the number of applicants who were considered to be unsuccessful at long-listing stage for not meeting the eligibility requirements.

Interviews

Interview Bookings

Applicants were invited to book interview slots on a first come first served basis through Oriel. Applicants had the choice of a face-to-face or a Skype interview.

Interview Attendance

A total of 808 applicants attended an interview for F2 Stand-alone foundation posts across two interview days and centres. Applicants only attended for one interview. Applicants had the option to attend the interview in person or via Skype.

Interview Outcomes

Of the 808 applicants who attended the interviews, a total of 673 applicants were deemed appointable, compared to 697 in 2018. A total of 430/514 (83%) applicants who attended interviews in person and 243/294 (82%) applicants who attended their interviews via Skype were appointable.

Offers

All offers were made through the national online application system (Oriel) on a meritocratic basis. There were three initial rounds of offers and a clearing process for F2 Stand-alone programmes.

The table below provides an overall summary of the number of posts available, offers made, posts accepted, posts declined, that were left to expire and withdrawals after the offers had been accepted and the fill rates for 2018 and 2019.

A total of 20 offers were accepted by UK nationals who graduated from overseas medical schools. This compares to 71 offers for F2 Stand-alone posts in 2018.

Offers Summary

The table below shows the number of F2 Stand-alone offers made, accepted, declined, expired, and accepted and later withdrawn from the initial offers round and the clearing process.

There were 92 places and 456 appointable applicants for F2 Stand-alone remaining in the process at the time the clearing process was run.

Of the 187 applicants who accepted offers, 118 were subject to Resident Labour Marker Tests (RLMT) and required sponsorship for Tier 2.

Of the 187 applicants who accepted F2 Stand-alone offers who were subject to RLMT and required sponsorship to apply for Tier 2 visas, 118 were sponsored. For further details about where these applicants were allocated, please refer to appendix 3.

F2 Preferences

Withdrawals

There were relatively few withdrawals throughout the Stand-alone recruitment process. The rate of withdrawals was relatively static from the point of application until after the point at which offers had been made and accepted as was the case in 2018.
