

# Foundation Programme 2016 Recruitment Stats and Facts Interim Report March 2016

#### **Summary Information for FP and AFP 2016 Recruitment**

1. **Applications submitted:** Before applicants can access the online application form they must be nominated by a UK medical school or the UKFPO's Eligibility Office, and then enrol in the recruitment round which involves creating an FPAS account and confirming they are a nominated applicant. A total of 7,909 applicants were nominated, with 7,876 enrolling and 7,858 submitting applications. Of the 7,858 who submitted applications, 1,490 applied to both the Foundation Programme (FP) and the Academic Foundation Programme (AFP) commencing in August 2016 (FP 2016 and AFP 2016 respectively).

2. **AFP 2016 recruitment**: There were 515 AFP vacancies across the UK. 2,252 AFP applications were submitted by 1,490 individuals: 51.14% applied to two academic units of application (AUoA). After completing a national application form with local variations through the Foundation Programme Application System (FPAS), AFP applicants followed local selection processes depending on which AUoA(s) they applied to. There was a single national offers date, followed by three cascade offer dates. After the third cascade, AUoAs were at liberty to contact applicants directly in an attempt to fill the final few places – this is referred to as the 'mop-up' in the table below. Two AFP programmes were left unfilled and were converted to FP programmes for inclusion in the FP allocation process.

- 3. **FP 2016 vacancies filled:** There were 7,112 FP vacancies in addition to the AFP vacancies discussed above. 100% of FP vacancies were filled during the national FP allocation on 03 March 2016.
- 4. **Oversubscription:** FP 2016 was oversubscribed and applicants were placed on either the primary or reserve list depending on their total application score:
  - a) **Primary list:** 94.3% of the 7,112 applicants on the primary list were allocated to one of their top five foundation schools. The cut off score for the primary list was 64.02.
  - b) **Reserve list:** 45 applicants were placed on the reserve list, including 38 current UK students and 7 other applicants. Reserve list applicants will be allocated to vacancies which arise due to withdrawals and failed finals. Reserve list allocations will be issued to applicants on 07 April, shortly after primary list applicants are informed of their match to programme results on 05 April 2016.
- 5. **Eligibility Office:** The UKFPO's Eligibility Office processed 628 applications. Of those, 459 were eligible to apply with 489 submitting FP applications. Of the 489, 333 were fully eligible and the others were eligible subject to providing evidence of their right to work in the UK, passing the clinical assessment or passing PLAB (or any combination of the three).
  - Of the total 628 who applied to the Eligibility Office, 220 (35.0%) were/are students of non-EEA medical schools, 381 (60.7%) were/are students of EEA medical schools and 27 (4.3%) were students of UK medical schools who graduated prior to 4 August 2013.
- 6. **Eligible applicants who need work permits:** There were 21 eligible applicants who had not provided evidence of their right to work in the UK by the stated deadline. As the Foundation Programme was once again oversubscribed these applications were not considered and the applicants were withdrawn from the national process.
- 7. Clinical skills assessments: 164 Eligibility Office applicants graduated more than two years before the start of FP/AFP 2014 and were required to take the clinical assessment. Of these, 110 sat the clinical assessment with the others being withdrawn for other reasons, failing to pay the fee or not attending. Of the 110 who attended, 89 (80.9%) passed and 21 (19.1%) failed the assessment. The cost was £850 per assessment paid by each applicant direct to the clinical assessment provider. The clinical assessment was delivered by the University Hospital of South Manchester.
- 8. **Failure to meet the person specification:** 36 applicants, 22 from UK medical schools and 14 from non-UK medical schools, were identified as having an exceptionally low SJT score of more than 3.5 standard deviations below the mean. In accordance with the process for handling exceptionally low SJT scores, the affected applicants were withdrawn from the process prior to the FP allocation for failing to meet the national person specification and invited to attend a face to face review of their SJT outcome on 15 March 2016. 28 applicants chose to attend the face to face review, 3 applicants were reinstated. For UK students, the heads of schools and pastoral care contacts at the applicants' medical schools were informed prior to the applicants being notified.

9. **Special circumstances:** 240 applicants were approved for pre-allocation to a particular foundation school based on special circumstances. Of these, 233 applicants are on the primary list and 7 of these applicants are on the reserve list. None of these applicants have withdrawn at the time of producing this report.

## **Local AFP and FP Applications**

Just over 37% of UK students who applied for an academic programme applied to the AUoA most local to their medical school for one of their AFP applications. If we exclude those applicants who accepted an AFP offer, 40% of UK students selected the foundation school associated with their medical school as first preference for their FP application.

The table shows the percentage of applicants from each UK medical school who applied to the most local AUOA if they applied for an AFP and the percentage who selected the foundation school associated with their medical school as first preference for their FP applications. Those applicants who accepted an AFP offer are excluded from the percentage for FP applications.

#### Errors made in completing the OMR answer sheet – SJT

The following section provides information around the errors made in completing the OMR answer sheet during the SJT. A correctly completed answer sheet includes 304 marks (5 per question in part one -47 ranking questions - plus 3 per question in part Two -23 multiple choice questions).

The majority (84%) of applicants completed the answer sheet in full and correctly, and of those applicants recording errors, 85% made only one or two errors. Proportionately more errors were made in Part One (89.5% of all errors, compared with 77% of the pencil marks on a correctly completed sheet) than in Part Two (10.5% of errors made compared with 23% of the pencil marks on a correctly completed sheet).

#### **Further Information:-**

- Errors in completing the answer sheet could be on live (60) or trial (10) items only errors made in completing live questions could affect score.
- One error could be one mark missing in one question, it does not mean that an applicant scored 0 for the whole question, only for that part of the question.
- The most common type of error was a multimark in Part One (either answering AACDE or tying the rank ie A as both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> rank).
- Part One types of error:
  - Blank Part 1 whole answer missing
  - o Partial Part 1 too few answers given but not a full missing answer
  - o Multimark Part 1 either answering AACDE or tying the rank ie A as both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> rank
  - o Blank Part 2 whole answer missing
  - o Partial Part 2 too few answers given but not a full missing answer
  - o Too many answers Part 2 four or more answers selected in a rank 3 question
