

- covers also the economical and environmental aspects of the non nuclear energies (fossil fuels, renewable energies, hydrogen)
- includes a unique collection of 900.000 documents of non-conventional literature available in full-text (most of them in .pdf).
- is strongly involved in Nuclear Knowledge Management.
