- (a) CDF's flag (1.8 m x 90 cm) is flown when CDF is present at, or visiting Service establishments (however, it is not flown at RAAF establishments, except when CDF is performing the role of reviewing officer), onboard Her Majesty's Australian (HMA) ships and in Service boats (at the bow), on Service aircraft (when stationary), as a car flag (15 cm x 23 cm) on official occasions, and on other occasions as directed.
- (b) The flag of VCDF (90 cm x 1.8 m) is flown when VCDF is present at, or visiting a Service establishment (however, it is not flown at RAAF establishments, except when VCDF is performing the role of reviewing officer), onboard HMA ships and in Service boats on Service aircraft (when stationary) as a car flag (15 cm x 23 cm) on official occasions, and on other occasions as directed.
- (c) CN's flag (91.5 cm x 1.37 m) is flown when CN is present at RAN establishments, onboard HMA ships and in Service boats, at Russell Offices Canberra, as a car flag (15 cm x 23 cm) on official occasions, and on other occasions as ordered.
- (d) CA's flag (90 cm x 1.8 m) is flown when CA is present at, or visiting major headquarters or installations, attending as a reviewing officer, as a car flag (15 cm x 23 cm) on official occasions, and on other occasions as ordered by CA.

- (e) CAF's flag (60 cm x 90 cm) is flown when CAF is present as a reviewing officer, on Service aircraft (when the aircraft is stationary), and on other occasions as ordered by CAF. CAF's flag is not used as a car flag; the RAAF Ensign, in miniature, is used as a car flag.
- (f) The commanders of functional commands each have a distinguishing flag.
- (g) For guidelines and rules pertaining to tri-Service (Joint) Command Appointment personal flags see DI(G) ADMIN 12–1.
 - Defaced ADFE with two stars to be used by Army incumbent in joint command/unit.
 Navy and RAAF fly single-Service two star personal flag approved by the applicable single service authority:
 - Defaced ADFE with one star is to be used by all one star joint appointments, except when a single-Service approved personal flag already exists for the specific appointment.
- (h) A brigade/task force commander of the rank of colonel may fly the commander's flag but, is not to use the star plate.
- (i) With the exception of CAF the design of both the distinguishing flag and the car flag are the same.
- (j) Star Plates are 12.5 cm high x 25 cm wide.
- (k) Stars are positioned centrally on Star Plates; when there is more than one star they are positioned centrally in a horizontal line.
- (I) When more than one background colour is used all colours are to be of equal dimensions.
- (m) The maximum dimensions for all car pennants are 15 cm in height and 23 cm in length.
- (n) The colours for star plates are as follows:
 - RAN: Navy Blue (BCC 219):
 - Army: Military Red (BCC 210): and
 - RAAF: Air Force Blue (BCC 131).
