B.8 TRANSFORMING CITIZENSHIP THROUGH CIVIC EDUCATION. APPROACHES, METHODS, EXPERIENCES

Starting from the last decade of XX Century, citizenship has been recognized as a factor of crucial importance for healthy democracies, not reducible to a legal status, but involving a multiplicity of cultural, social, political and economic dimensions as well. The same moment of this revival, however, has been the one in which a deep crisis of the pillars of citizenship has been noticed and variously thematized. As a consequence of this return-and-escape paradox, citizenship as a whole is nowadays more and more a contested and uncertain issue.

Citizenship or civic education is, of course, deeply affected by this paradoxical situation. The widespread uncertainty on what citizenship actually is, or should be, today, obviously challenges education. It is shown, for example, by the multiplicity of names, approaches and organizational solutions in the EU countries emerging from the Eurydice reports.

However, if we look at citizenship as a phenomenon that is shaped and transformed not only by constitutional or high-rank norms, but also by public policies, administrative rules and procedures, judgements, civil regulations, and by citizenship practices as well, we can observe civic education from a different angle. That is, as one of the places where citizenship is redefined and transformed in practice and not only as a mirror of the criticalities of democratic citizenship.

The case of school facing multicultural societies is a good example of this transformative attitude of civic education. The inherited paradigm refers indeed to a political community linked by a common and unique culture, including history, heritage, religion, language, material culture, etc. But the need for changing frames of reference and patterns of citizenship education in relation to the presence of children with immigrant background at school, is leading to a transformation not only of civic education, but of citizenship paradigm itself. The role of school as socialization (or, in this case, of "citizenization") agent, thus, becomes more and more salient.

- In this framework, the panel purpose is to discuss some relevant issues, such as:
- The ways in which civic education is facing the ongoing crisis and transformation of democratic citizenship;
- The main components of citizenship paradigm that are at stake (belonging as legal and social status; as identity; rights and duties; participation);



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- The main challenges that, from educational point of view, teachers and other actors are facing;
- The ongoing innovations in citizenship education methodologies, with particular regard to the learning effects of non-conventional approaches;
- The relation between professional patterns of teachers and changes in citizenship education.

Papers dealing with the general issue or presenting case studies, documentation of experiences, innovative educational methodologies and their learning impact on students, projects focused on the professional background of teachers, will be welcome.

Please <u>do not submit your ABSTRACT/PAPER</u> by e-mailing it to the Convenor(s) of the Panel session you chose. Convenor(s) will receive submitted ABSTRACTS/PAPERS automatically from the <u>pre-conference tool</u> and they are going to reject <u>ABSTRACT/PAPER</u> submitted to their e-mail addresses.

Language for ABSTRACTS/PAPERS is English.

You can submit an ABSTRACT or in case you prefer a PAPER. <u>Be careful</u>: **DO NOT SUBMIT BOTH AB-STRACT AND PAPER**. EITHER YOU SUBMIT THE FORMER OR THE LATTER.

ABSTRACT/PAPER should include:

- 1. Title (limited to 20 words in UPPER CASE)
- 2. Author's name and surname, institution, and email address
- 3. Five keywords
- 4. ABSTRACT's text (limited to 500 words). In case you decide for the PAPER, text will be 3.500 words min. 5.000 words max. In the submission text, please write: ABSTRACT or PAPER after the title. Example: FAMILY BACKGROUNDS AND STUDENT ENGAGEMENT IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS. A CASE STUDY (PAPER).

The Conference formula is: 1 SUBMISSION = 1 FEE (check FEES webpage)

It is possible to submit a maximum of 2 ABSTRACTS/PAPERS per person (double submission must concern 2 different Panel Sessions). Each ABSTRACT/PAPER is eligible if it is backed by an APP FEE.

Co-authors who do not submit ABSTRACT/PAPER as first author may access to the Conference via the discounted P FEE (check FEES webpage).

The submitting and presenting author must be listed as the first author in the <u>pre-conference tool</u>. Please note that the submitting author will receive all correspondence about the ABSTRACT/PAPER. Therefore, we recommend that the submitting author details that are entered are the same details as those of the presenting author.

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Before you submit, please make sure the following requirements are met:

- ABSTRACT/PAPER must be allocated to a specific Panel session. Therefore, you must select the proper Panel when submitting. For a complete listing of Panel sessions please **click here**.
- If possible, write your ABSTRACT/PAPER highlighting methods, outcomes, references. Word count is affected by inclusion of references.
- Convenors and the Scientific Committee will review all submitted ABSTRACTS/PAPERS. Notification regarding acceptance and scheduling will be sent to the submitting author via the pre-conference tool.

Please note, if your ABSTRACT/PAPER is accepted, you will be permitted a maximum of 20 minutes for oral presentation.
